Dear Elected Parties of the 2022 General Election,

Congratulations on your election to parliament and thank for your offering yourselves to serve Fiji.

The faith communities of Fiji have prayed for you throughout the election process. Today members of the Fiji Council of Churches and Pacific Conference of Churches gathered at Nazareth Prayer Centre to pray for you as you work to form a coalition government which will be in the best interest of all Fijians.
